## What is Meadow All About...

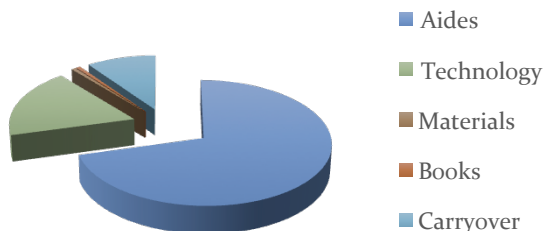
Meadow Elementary is dedicated to student learning. The Step-Up intervention plan provides an opportunity for ALL students to learn the individual skills they need to succeed. Teachers collaborate each Monday, using data, to make sure students progress on their individual goals. This program has been so effective in helping all students at all levels, that many districts have come to observe the grade levels in action. These principals and teachers have returned to their prospective schools and implemented similar programs there. Our philosophy is that we take responsibility for every child's learning. Not just the children in a teacher's class, but every student. We celebrate successes and collaborate to increase those successes. The innovations that have been made at Meadow makes it an exceptional place to learn and grow.

## Land Trust Funds

Each year Meadow Elementary receives funds from the state to use for school improvement, which directly impacts students learning. Meadow received \$69,755 in Land Trust Funds for the 2013-2014 school year. The majority of the funds were used to run the Step-Up program, increase technology, and professional development.

There was a carry-over of \$8,000, which the SCC School Community Council voted to use as professional development, sending 6 teachers to the "Ron Clark Academy" to be trained in student engagement and motivation.
