2023-2024 LAND TRUST LITERACY/MATH/SCIENCE GOAL

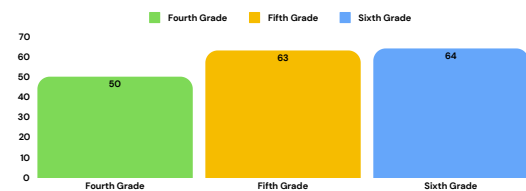
Our goal is to have over 60% of our 4th – 6th grade students reach proficiency level in Language Arts, Math, and Science as measured by the RISE assessment.

How funds were spent to work toward goal:

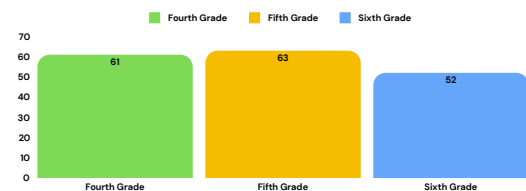
- Aides for Double Dose Tier II Reading and Math Interventions

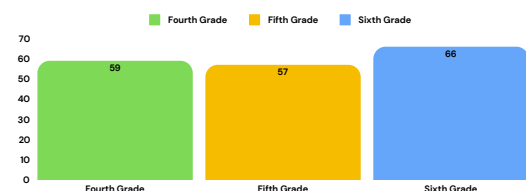
