## r.a.d. KIDS Needs Volunteers



r.a.d. KIDS is a great program that we teach to the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade students every year. It teaches them about safety and how to stay out of danger and what to do if they find themselves in a dangerous situation. We are in need of 1-2 more instructors for the upcoming year(s). If you find yourself in a position that you could do this, we would like to know ASAP. You will need to be trained as a certified instructor, which costs over \$400. The PTA will pay for this, however, we would need a commitment of at least 2-3 years in order to feel like it was money well spent. The approximate time that you would need to put into this each year would be about 3 hours a day, every day, for the first 5 weeks of school plus some meetings/assignments ahead of time to prepare for the upcoming classes. If we are able to train 2 more instructors, we would be able to divide the daily instruction up among each of the instructors, so that it wouldn't be too time consuming on any one person. ## School Community Council Elections Coming Up



Serving on our School Community Council is a wonderful way for parents and teachers to contribute and help improve academic performance at our school. The school receives an annual dividend from the school trust lands. Our council decides how these funds will be used. This year our school received approximately \$36,000 from the School LAND Trust Program. The council reviews and prepares other academic plans for our students each year. All plans are reviewed for final approval by our school board. Councils also act in an advisory capacity to school and school district administrations.

### Qualifications

Every public school in Utah has a School Community Council. The councils are made up of school employees who are elected by employees and parents who are elected by parents of students attending the school. Membership terms are for two years. Elections are held at the end of each school year. Parent members must have a student attending the school at least one of the two years of their term of service. Employees must be employed by the school district at the school.

This year's SCC election will take place May 7-9. Ballots will be sent home with your student and if you would like to vote, you may fill out that ballot and return it to the office yourself or place it in a sealed envelope with the words "SCC Election" and send it to school with your child. We would also ask that you sign your name over the seal of the envelope. This will insure that the vote will be counted and has not been tampered with.

If you would like the opportunity to run for this position, please let me know by April 22 (earlier would be better). Also we would ask that you prepare a short paragraph about yourself and a photo that we can attach to the ballot so all will get to know who you are. We welcome any and all who qualify to be on the ballot and have an opportunity to be voted in. 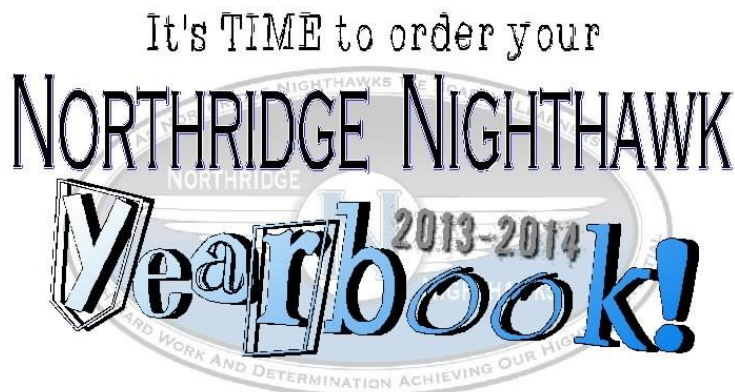
