## Federal And State Reports

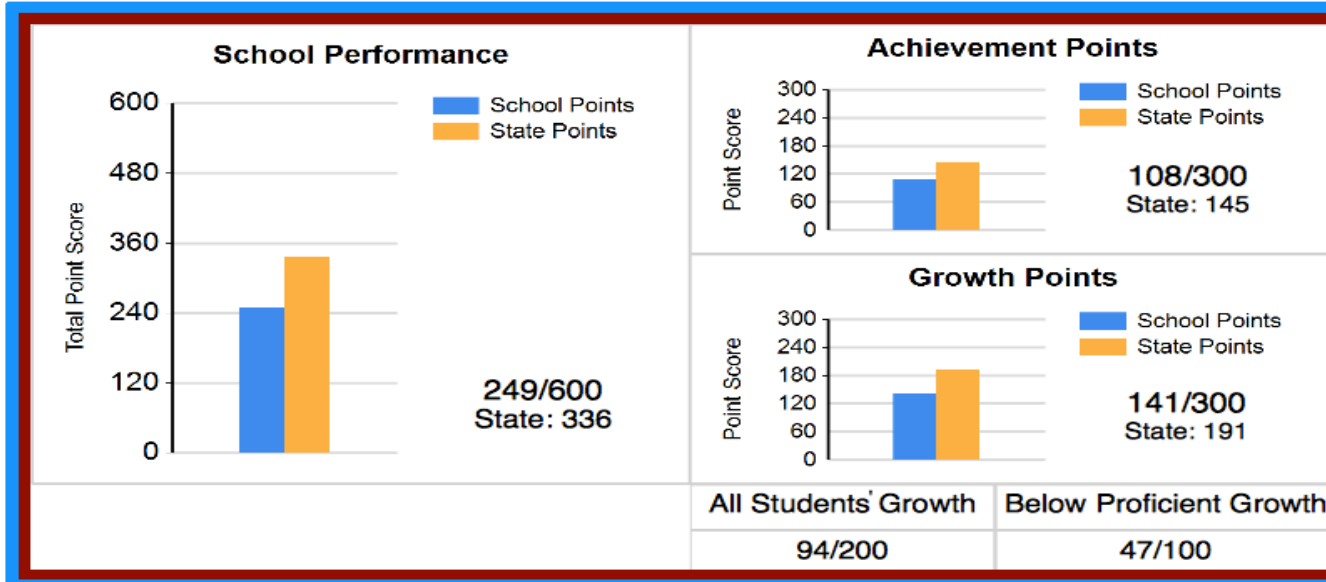

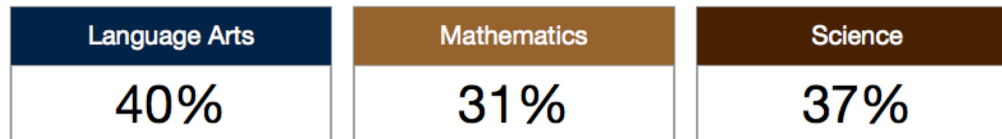
