

Parent Drop Off and Pick Up Guidelines

Safety is very important to all of us. Please follow these guidelines to help all of our students, staff, and patrons.

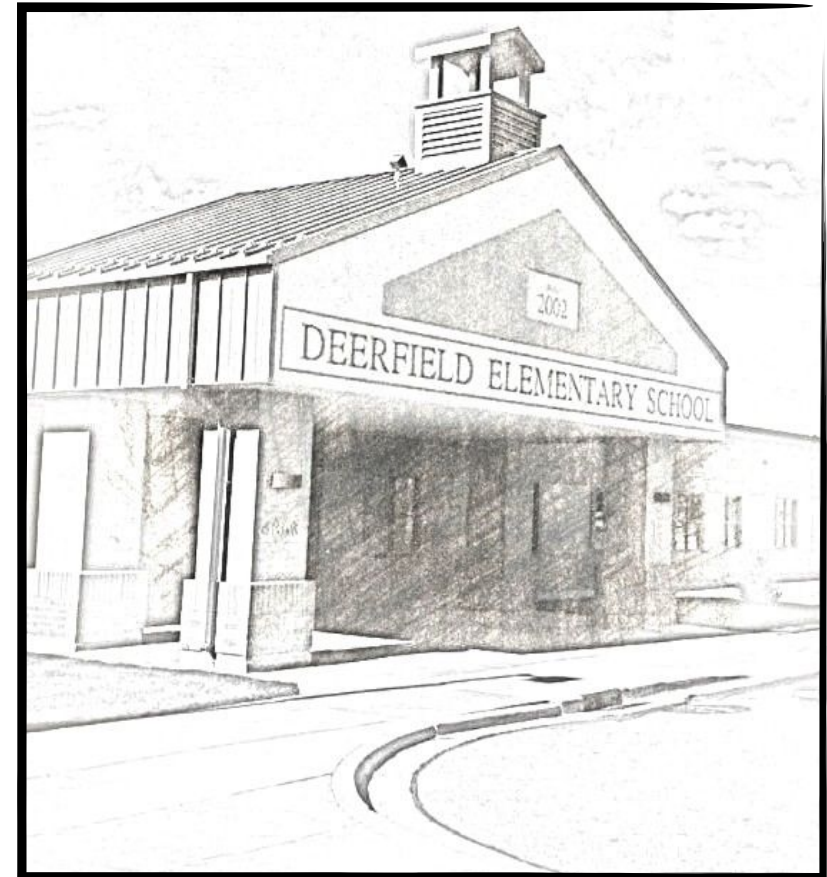
- Upon entering the Deerfield Elementary School Driveway, please maintain a single file line in the right hand lane. Vehicles should pull up to the most forward spot before stopping. Parents should remain in the vehicle. Please do not block the crosswalk. The bus lane is reserved for buses 15 minutes before and after school starting and ending times. Remember we have two starting and two ending times for school.
- All passengers should exit and enter vehicles on the curbside of the vehicle. The outer lane of the driveway is for people exiting the school. Please do not let students exit or enter your car until you are curbside. Do not use the parking lot as a drop off or pick up lane.
- If you need to run into the school for any reason, you should park in the front parking lot. Do not leave your car unattended by the curb. Parents using the front lot before and after school should park and walk with their children to and from the building using the designated crosswalks.
- If parents park on the street, students should use the sidewalk near the crossing guard to enter the school and not cut through the parking lot. Children being dropped off on the north side of the street should cross Harvey Boulevard using the crossing guard.
- The Kindergarten turn around is for Kindergarten pick up only at 3:30.

Bikes, blades, and boards

If students roller blade, or ride a skateboard, scooter or bike to school, they must walk them when they get onto school grounds. Bike racks are in the back of the school. **Please lock up your bikes!**

Attendance

1. Upon arrival at school, students should stay outside to play until the bell rings. When the bell rings, teachers will escort students to their classrooms while other teachers will be waiting by the classroom door to greet the children
2. The front door and the office are opened for parent use from 7:30 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.
3. Parents are requested to notify the school prior to, or the morning of their child's absence. The school phone number is 610-8106. Teachers will contact parents after three unexcused absences.
4. Students arriving late should have a note from their parent and take it to their classroom teacher so they can be marked excused late.
5. To check your student out during school, you or someone on your Emergency Contact list must come to the main office.

Breakfast/Lunch

Breakfast and lunch are served at school every day. Breakfast is served daily from 7:30-7:55 and 8:45-9:10. The student price for breakfast is \$.85. The cost for lunch is \$1.50. Students may purchase monthly lunch credits for \$30.00. Milk will continue to be \$.25. Lunch credits should be purchased in the morning before school begins. (Checks should be made to Alpine School Lunch.) Free or reduced prices are available to those who qualify. District forms are available upon registration and may also be obtained any time from the office. (Adults can purchase breakfast for \$1.50 and lunch for \$2.50.)

Parent Teacher Conferences

Recess/Bad Weather Days

When the temperature reaches 20 degrees (taking into account the wind chill) or if it is steadily raining, we will call for inside recess. A blue flag will be posted outside the gym hallway doors letting students know if it is an inside morning when they arrive. All students will go into the gym until the bell rings and teachers come to pick them up
